Forty-Two Years of Service

Since 1968, we have been providing guidance and support to school volunteer programs and thousands of New Hampshire children have been touched by the efforts of countless school volunteers. In the academic year 2009-2010, over 35,000 volunteers provided almost one million hours of service to almost 200 schools in New Hampshire who reported a total enrollment of over 113,000 students.

There are over 600 schools in New Hampshire divided by K-8 public schools, 9-12 public schools and K-12 non-public schools. Our continued goal is to foster, support and facilitate volunteer programs in each school in the Granite State.

Gold Circle Awards

The Gold Circle Awards celebrates the valuable partnerships that schools and volunteer programs have with local businesses. By receiving volunteer and other resource support from organizations in their community, schools are able to balance resources to provide their students with the best educational experience possible.

Blue Ribbon Awards

The Blue Ribbon Awards recognizes the extraordinary efforts of school volunteer coordinators and their volunteer teams for the achievements realized during the previous school year. In 2009, 196 schools and their volunteer programs were selected to receive the Blue Ribbon award. A statewide award ceremony to recognize and award these outstanding volunteer programs is held each year.

Education Station

Introduced in 2008, this program is designed to collect donated classroom supplies from local businesses and organizations and distribute them to New Hampshire schools.

Power of the Penny Campaign

This annual campaign was created in an effort to teach children the significance of saving and to raise money for their schools. The campaign runs from October through April, at which time the schools report their outcome by identifying the school goal; the amount raised, the community involvement and most importantly, the learning experience for the children. For the 2009-2010 year, over 2.5 million pennies was raised – almost all of it donated to charity.

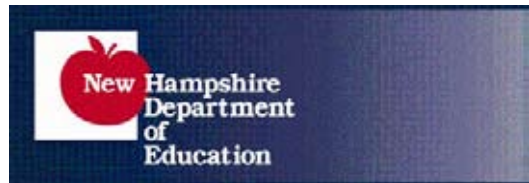
